2019 Season Recap

The summer of 2019 marked the 6th season of competition in the New York Collegiate Baseball League for the Genesee Rapids. The season was filled with many highlights including a playoff push that lasted until the final week but came up just short. Enjoy reliving some of our favorite memories.

- With a new points format implemented this summer giving 2 points for a win and 1 point for a tie after 10 innings, the Rapids finished the summer with 37 points and an overall record of 18-23-1. This placed them 4th in the Western Division only 2 points away from a playoff spot.
- The 2018 roster saw 30 players suit up for the Rapids from 20 different colleges and universities.
- Brett Lindsay, an IF from Eastern Mennonite University, was the team leader in batting average (.284), hits (40), and RBI (19).
- Brenndan Rogers, a Pitcher from Eastern Nazarene College, was the Rapids only representative on the NYCBL All-Star Team. In the NYCBL's 3-0 victory over the Atlantic Coast Baseball League, Rogers pitched a scoreless inning with 3 strikeouts earning him the honor of the game's Most Valuable Pitcher. Rogers also had the 4th highest total of strikeouts in the league (40) and his 4.01 ERA also placed him in the top 10 of pitchers this summer (8th). He was also honored with a nomination to the NYCBL All League Team at the end of the season.
- The Rapids played solid defense all summer long. Their .957 fielding percentage was 3rd best in the NYCBL.
- Three different Rapids, Caleb Edman, Jaylon Lee (twice) and Brenndan Rogers (twice), earned Player of the Day Awards.
- Kids' Day was a huge success this summer! Over 1,300 elementary school students from the area came to watch the Rapids come from behind win against Olean.
- Over 50 campers came to this year's baseball camps where they received direct instruction from Rapids players and coaches. Potential plans for 2020 include specialized training opportunities and possibly a softball camp!
- The Rapids fans continue to show awesome support for the team. Attendance rose about 19% to 5,231 this summer. This placed the team 3rd overall in the league for attendance. Kids' Day and Fireworks nights were the most popular games.
- Thanks to increased concession stand sales, increased player roster size and very generous support from the Ted Hopkins Memorial Scholarship Fund, the Rapids finished the year financially in the black.
